Orange Tip (Female is white) April – June Caterpillars eat garlic mustard, lady's smock, sweet rocket & honesty Overwinters as a chrysalis in shrubs or trees.	Anthocharis cardamines	
Peacock  March – May and July – September  Caterpillars live only on Nettles  Adult butterflies overwinter in sheds or cracks in trees.	Inachis io	
Ringlet June – July  Caterpillars feed on grasses and overwinter at the base of grasses.	Aphantopus hyperantus	
Six-spot Burnet Moth June - August  Caterpillars feed on and overwinter in Bird's-foot trefoil	Zygaena filipendulae	
Small Heath May – September  Caterpillers feed on and overwinters in grasses	Coenonympha pamphilus
